
























ROOM 7S - THE ARTISTS


ROOM 14 PROGRAM CELEBRATIONS

We can't wait to see more amazing work in Term 2. Well done Room 18 🔾















BSDS SPEECH PATHOLOGY TIPS

HOLIDAYS: A WONDERFUL TIME FOR COMMUNICATION

One of the key ingredients to promoting communication is having something to talk about. Holidays provide us that ingredient in abundance. Here are some ideas to make the most of the holidays as a time to build on our young people's skills: comprehending what is happening around them; expressing themselves, and engaging in positive social interactions with friends, family and the wider community.

Use a calendar - Any simple calendar or A4 page with the days marked will do. Make sure there is enough room to write/draw a picture/or put a photo on the day. Clearly mark the holidays (the days they will not be going to school) then add on any activities that will be happening on the different days. For example: going to the park, visiting Grandma, cousins coming to stay. At the end of the day they can cross off the day on the calendar. Talk about what is happening the next day. How many days until...?

Make a visual diary - Use a scrap book or blank paper to make a page of what happened during the day. They might like to draw or write or stick in something that will remind them of the day e.g. - a movie ticket, an autumn leaf, photos from a flyer, streamers from a party, a photo of a friend they saw. Talk about what they can remember, help them to write, draw, or paste something visual to remember the day. A visual diary can be great way look back at what you have done in the holidays.

Talk about photos - We all take lots of photos and this is a fantastic way to support sharing information about exciting things that happen during the day. Help your young person be the one to show and tell what they have been doing during the day by showing the photos that were taken to other family members and visitors.

Prepare for events - Social occasions can be fun but also overwhelming. Refer to the calendar to indicate what is coming up. Before the event it can be good to communicate: where you are going; who will be there; what will happen; what they need to do, and when it will finish. For example: "We are going to Grandad's house. We are going to Grandad's birthday party. Your cousins and 5 grown-ups will be there. You can say 'Happy Birthday Grandad' and give him his present. We will come home after we sing Happy Birthday and have cake."

Playdates - Play dates with friends, neighbours, or cousins provide a great chance to build interaction skills. A short 1 to 1 playtime doing something that both young people like can be lots of fun. Provide more support and structure if they find it challenging to play together independently. Some fun autumn activities might include: jumping in leaves, collecting leaves and pine cones, sensory play with autumn flavours, making a collage, making an indoor cubby, cooking scones, origami, board games, making a card to post to a friend, or making pom-poms.

Quiet time - Holidays are also an important time to rest. It's in the quiet times like sharing a book, looking at nature or any peaceful joint interaction that communication and relationships can flourish. One of the most valuable and enjoyable things to promote your young person's communication in the holidays is just to spend quality quiet time with you.







BSDS OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY TIPS

LETTER FORMATION

Letter formation is the ability to form the letters of the alphabet correctly. Correct letter formation makes handwriting more legible and efficient. For a child to form all letters they first need to be able to form the prewriting shapes.

At BSDS our occupational therapists help teach pre-writing shapes and correct letter formation using a range of multisensory activities which make handwriting fun and engaging for our students. Our handwriting programs are informed by the Hartley Knows and Handwriting Without Tears programs.

Visual cues: We use visual cues such as coloured dots to show where letters start and end as well as arrows to show the direction the pencil travels. We also model writing the letters before the student has a turn.

Auditory cues: We use directional language such as "P goes down, lift up and around".

Tactile input: Making the letters with different mediums e.g. - playdoh, paint, toys, shaving cream.

Activities to work on letter formation

- Using favourite toys e.g. racing a car over the letter
- Writing the letter with different mediums such as paint, water or chalk
- Building letters with Lego or blocks
- Making letters with items found outside such as leaves, sticks and stones
- Writing letters in sand, rice or shaving cream
- Making the letters with playdough
- Making the letters with our bodies or 'writing' the letter in the air with our arm or leg















BSDS TAKE HOME TIPS

KEY WORD SIGN TIPS - LET'S PLAY!

Can you have fun with sign language while learning or practising it? Yes! When it comes to learning to sign, the secret to success is to make it relevant and useful to your daily life and your communication with your child and learning words associated with play is perfect! Using signs in playful and engaging ways gets your child's attention and stimulates their interest in signing like nothing else. By playing with your child you can explore, discover, learn and have fun together while learning some KWS yourself. Using verbs or adjectives during play can support your child's vocab and by modelling KWS like 'help/more/finished/go' in the matching context during play, you are supporting your child's expressive language and are providing them with a model of a sign they could use in that same context at another time. So sit down, start to play and see how much you can learn!
