
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### **ROOM 20'S SPECTACULAR SLIME**






## **BIRTHDAY FUN**

## **GOLDILOCKS AND ROOM 26**










The students in Room 26 have had so much fun reading and exploring 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'.










## **SCIENCE IN ROOM 9**


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#### THE THREE LITTLE PIGS WITH ROOM 27










## **SCIENCE IN ROOM 10S**

We have enjoyed handwriting and mark making activities linked to the story. We have also been working on our fine motor skills and each student has made amazing crafts of each of the animals.














## **HOW THE BIRDS GOT THEIR COLOURS**


#### **MEALTIMES**


