





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SCIENCE WITH ROOM 18S

This term in Science, Room 18S have been investigating how plants grow by setting up our own hydroponic garden to grow mixed lettuce leaves. Using 2-litre soft drink bottles, we planted seeds on a bed of coconut coir. We fed a cotton wick through the neck of the bottle to draw water and nutrients from the reservoir below to feed our seedlings. Then, we placed our gardens in a sunny spot in our classroom. Each week we have been measuring and recording how much our plants have grown. After two weeks they have already grown 4cm high! We are enjoying watching them grow and hope to harvest the lettuce to make a salad to enjoy during our Cooking program later in the term.


















WINTER IS HERE









This semester in Room 7S we have been practising our typing every week and have made some amazing typed work! This week we typed out our sentences from our

'Photo of the Week' activity and all the students found images to match their photos.

















KITCHEN GARDEN AT BSDS





The students have been preparing the vegetable beds at Sorrento in time for Spring where they have been weeding, turning new soil/compost added to the veggie beds, planting seedlings, raising seeds, building a greenhouse, and maintaining the garden space through raking, sweeping and watering.

The Dimboola campus students have been exploring raising seeds in their mini classroom greenhouses; making funny vegetable people; raising Jack's Beanstalks (which are growing very tall!); making seed balls out of clay, soil and seeds; making bird seed feeders for the garden; and making grass seed heads – just to mention a few activities.



Types of Scissors:











Tabletop scissors

- Making short snips
- Cutting across the paper
- Cutting along a thick line
- Cutting out basic shapes
- Cutting out different shapes and pictures



Developing Scissor Skills at Home

You can help develop your child's scissor skills at home with everyday activities or during play. Remember to supervise your child when using scissors!









Other helpful tips:



Talk about what your child is doing to help with motor planning. "Open, close, open, close."

Talk about using their "helper" hand (non-dominant hand) to hold the thing that they are cutting.


