


















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Physical Education at Broadmeadows SDS

## ENGAGEMENT

We ran a Parent's Topic Taster session on engagement last term at the Dimboola campus. Engagement is the key to learning and language development, and is a big focus for your child's teaching team here at BSDS.



### Here are some of the strategies we talked through



## I. Get down on your child's level

If your child is lying on the floor or sitting at a table, position your body so that you are at eye level with them. This helps your child to feel safe and is beneficial for their communication development, as they can easily see your facial expressions and observe your mouth and tongue movements while you're talking.



## 2. Observe and narrate

Observe what your child plays with and how they play. Talk about what they are doing, for example, "You're lining up the cars, 1, 2, 3", "Another car", "A green car!"



## 3. Follow their lead, copy

Once you have observed how your child plays, join in by copying them! If they're singing, clapping, dancing, do the same. If they're using an object to play, get your own and join in.



## 4. Back and forth interactions

Take turns when playing with your child, pausing and waiting expectantly for their reaction. If they smile, look at you, move their body or say "more", then continue the interaction.



# 5. Have fun!

Most importantly, have fun and be silly with your child! They will want to continue engaging with you when you're having fun together.

## SENSORY HANDWRITING

Sensory Handwriting is using one or more senses to learn handwriting. For example, using a range of tactile materials for your children to 'feel' and 'write' the letters. This approach helps struggling readers or writers to learn how to read and write. It's also a great way for your children to practice pre-handwriting shapes, lines and letter formation without holding a pencil. It's a more fun and engaging way to learn handwriting.



#### Examples of senses using for handwriting learning

Involves feeling the letters, lines or shapes through the use of edible playdough, salt, sugar, rice or shaving Tactile cream, etc.

> Tip: Try using a big, flat tray to reduce the mess when doing this activity. Children can also use the rubber tip of the pencil to trace the letters.









Visual

Involves seeing the letters, lines or shapes in a fun way. For example, using a light-up board.



Audio

Involves listening to the letters' name, which helps with letter recognition, or listening to books with sounds.
