


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LET'S PREP TOGETHER

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





















LET'S LEARN TOGETHER

Reading is a great way to spend time with your child while also helping them to develop their literacy and language skills. Even if they can't read, you can have a great time exploring books together.


If your child is just beginning to engage with books, you can help them by:



- Pointing to pictures as you read and naming things.
- Asking them to turn the page. Build their excitement by saying "What's next?"
- Turning the book upside down or back to front and showing them how to fix it.

If your child already engages with books, you can help them to explore them more by:

- Asking them to choose books to read.
- Pointing to the words as you read them.
- Pointing to the pictures as asking questions like "What can you see?" or "What are they doing?"
- Ask them questions to build their anticipation and interest like "What will happen next?"

What is B-Street?

 $B-Street\ is\ a\ four-bedroom,\ PURPOSE\ BUILT\ short-term\ accommodation\ for\ children\ and\ young\ people\ aged\ 6-18\ years\ old,\ living\ with\ a\ disability.$

Overnight accommodation in our purpose-built house could really help your young person to thrive.

We support children and young people to develop new skills, increase independence, develop positive interpersonal relationships, and increase community participation. We can provide positive behaviour support services if required.

We are open 3pm-9am Monday-Friday

24 hours a day during weekends and school holidays

We are closed Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Good Friday through to Easter Monday

NDIS participants aged 6 to 18 years of age can use the NDIS line items *Core Supports* and/or *Capacity Building Supports* to access this service.
