

This term, students are working on developing, defining and enhancing these fundamental skills in their Physical Education classes. Check out what we've all been up to!



























We use routines everyday whether we are at school or home.


An example of a routine we do at school is unpacking our school bag.

Routines we do at home every day might include:

Routines are a great way for children to develop their language and understanding. For this, it's important to do the routine the same way every day by using the same steps and the same language.


Repetition is key for children to begin to associate the language with the steps of the routine and build their language skills! It's also an opportunity to model key words and develop your child's vocabulary.



An example of routines you can do at home is:






DRAWING



Drawing is a fun way to practice and refine the skills required for handwriting.

Visual-motor integration is a skill required to be able to copy and draw basic shapes (diagonal lines, circles, squares, triangles, and intersecting lines) necessary before we are able to learn to form our letters correctly.

Visual- motor integration involves effective, efficient communication between the eyes and the hands, so that you are able to copy, draw or write what you see.



A component of visual motor integration (visual perception) also helps us to keep our work on the line, and helps us to check that letters and words are correctly formed.

Students in Room 20S have been copying more complex lines and shapes using step by step instructions to draw their own Pikachu! Building on our visual-motor integration, functional fine motor skills and working memory.
