
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
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SPECTACULAR SHAPES

Outstanding work, Room 2!!














LET'S MAKE A CAKE THAT'S YUM!

Look at all the different footprints! Keep up the great work, Room 9!



















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
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READY FOR TAKE OFF

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STORYTIME IN ROOM 4S





The easiest way to complete heavy work is through using your body. Moving, lifting or engaging in any movement using all of your body weight is the simplest way to get a lot of input through muscles and joints.

Below are some ideas for heavy work that can be done at home.



Routine Jobs

- Taking out the rubbish
- Pushing a vacuum cleaner
- Mopping or sweeping
- Carrying heavy items such as a full laundry basket or groceries
- Cooking (e.g., stirring or kneading dough)
- Re-arranging furniture








Outside
