





### **RESOURCE CREATION**












### **PIZZA PARTY IN ROOM 6S**

### **HEAVY WORK**

Regulation is an important part in every child's day and plays a big role in children being ready to play and learn. One of the ways to support student's regulation is to provide proprioceptive input.



Proprioceptive input is the feeling we get into our muscles and joints. Sensory input from this system can help get and keep the body in a 'just right' space so that it can do what it needs to do.

#### Heavy work is one way to get this input into the body.

Heavy work is when joints and muscles are used in an activity like lifting, pushing, or pulling, which creates pressure on them. Heavy work activities can be used to help students focus, learn and take part in their daily activities. Heavy work helps to organise the brain and body so that our students can be ready to work well.

#### Examples of heavy work that can be tried at home

- Carrying a full laundry basket
- Carrying groceries/ something heavy
- Push ups on the ground or on a wall
- Pushing a wheelbarrow or trolley
- Jumping on a trampoline or star jumps
- Tug of war
- Using a vacuum cleaner
- Watering plants







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### **HOLIDAYS! TIME TO PLAY TOGETHER**

The holidays are coming and that hopefully means some time for families to relax and have some rest after the hectic school term. Often though families can be super busy in holiday times too. We want our children to have fun in the holidays and also have opportunities to grow their skills, develop positive relationships with family and friends. One of the best ways to do this is through interactive play.

By participating in shared and meaningful social routines like interactive play children and young people of all ages practice their ability to make sense of and co-ordinate with others actions.

Playing interactive games is a great way individuals develop social communication. Interactive games that challenge students to think, explore, and respond are powerful for teaching new skills, knowledge, and insights into how to interact with others.

Skills can be from the foundations to quite complex for example: learning to attend to other people, responding, taking turns, learning rules of interaction, learning cooperation, and collaboration.

Interactive games are ones that have the goals: to have fun, to interest and to be with one another. Interactive play has a lot of practical benefits for the holidays: it can be done at home with the resources you have at hand, the key ingredient is the people playing together; it is developmentally worthwhile for every age group and with fun and engagement as a focus it can help build positive relationships and make the holidays more enjoyable.

#### Here are some interactive play ideas that you could include in the holidays:

- Chasings
- Hide and seek
- Creeping up / What's the time Mr wolf
- Guess what's in the box
- Catch / Basketball / Bowling / balloon volleyball
- Build a Lego or duplo together

- Bingo, Zingo, Snakes and Ladders, Lotto, Memory,
   Connect 4.
- Card games Play card games like Snap, and Go
   Fish, Uno
- Charades or dress ups
- Dancing together

   Try "Just Dance" or take turns
  to copy each other or make up a new move.
