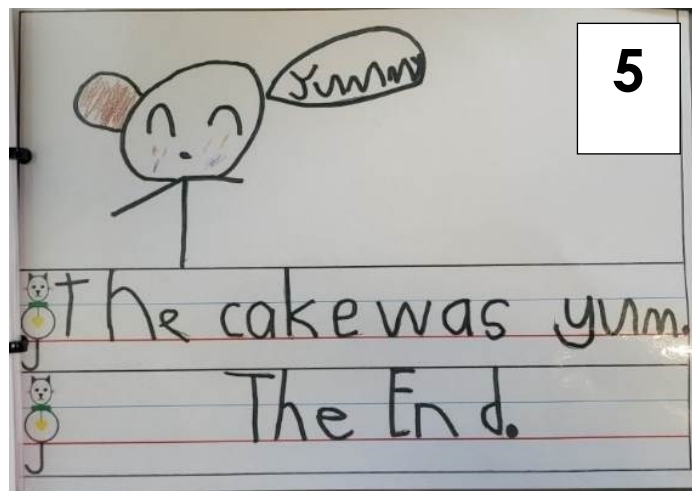
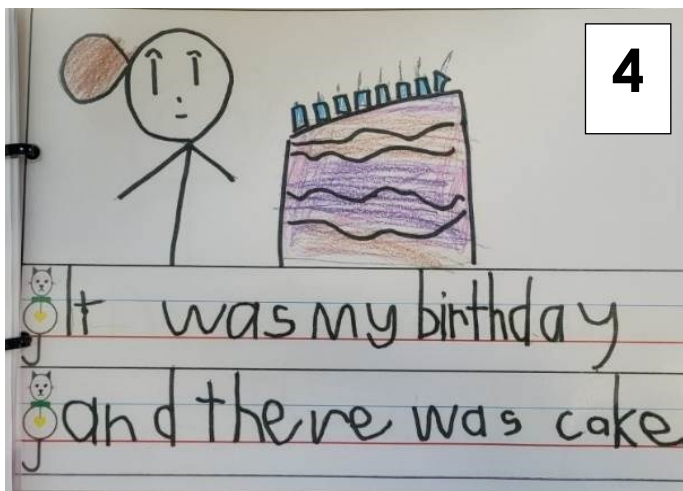
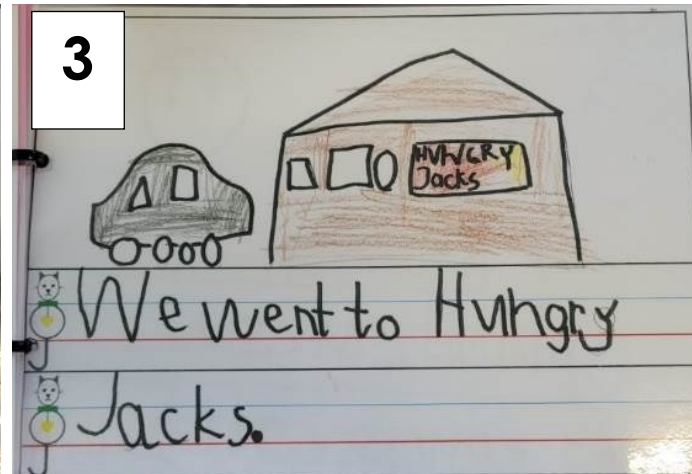
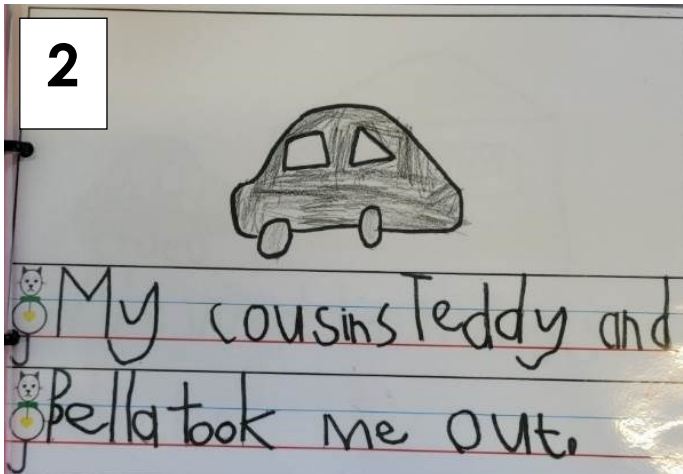
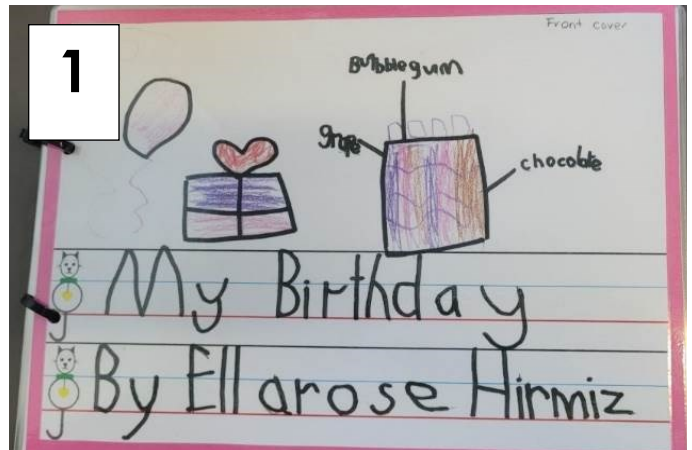


PHOTO DAY IS COMING!

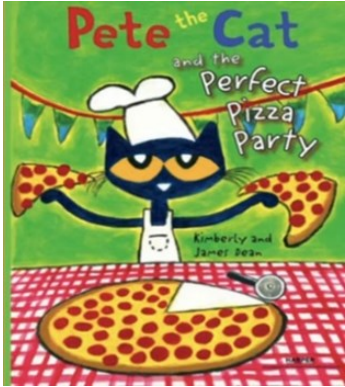

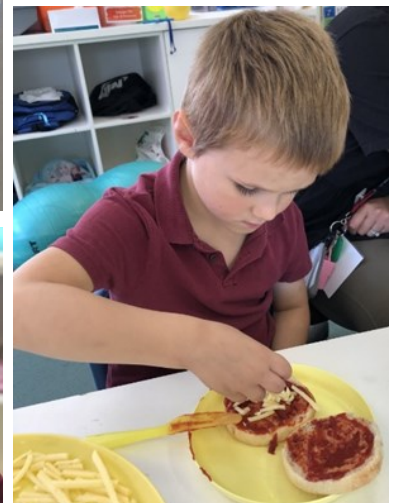
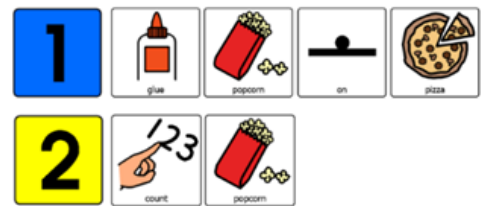
A GROOVY PIZZA PARTY



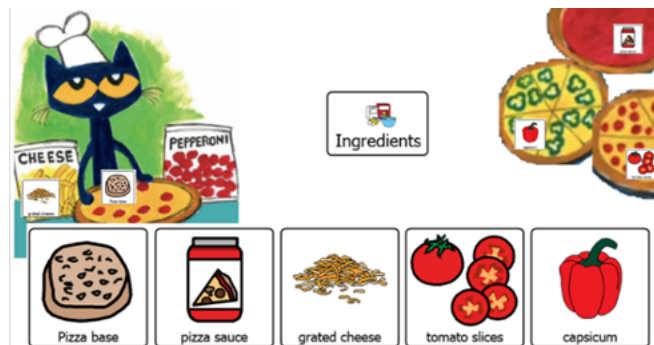

FRUIT PROGRAM

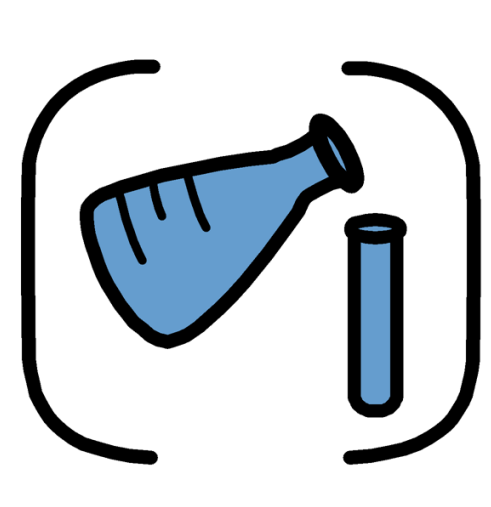

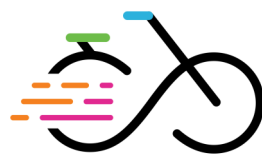
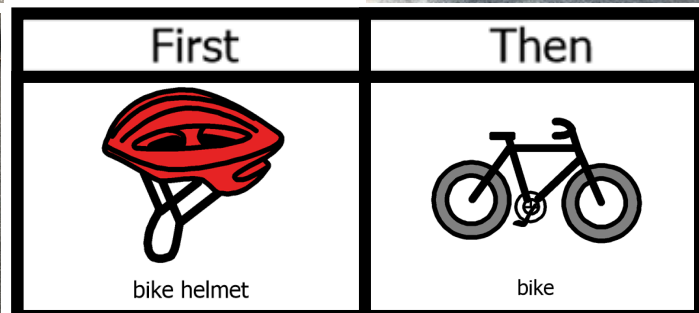


BIKE RIDING AT BSDS

Our students have been very active by riding on bikes this year, including riding during morning mod, playtimes, movement breaks and in classroom bike education sessions. We have a variety of types of bikes at school, including 2-wheel bikes, trikes, balance bikes, modified bikes and therapy bikes. It has been such a pleasure seeing the enjoyment and sense of achievement on the student's faces, and watching them gain confidence and increase their skills in bike riding. Bike riding is great for fitness, socializing with friends, and for students to regulate themselves so that they feel calm and ready to learn.



For more support around bike riding skill development Occupational Therapists and Physiotherapists can provide bike assessments and intensive bike education programs. Specialised bike assessment clinics can be accessed in the community, including the Freedom Wheels program. NDIS funding may be used to support students who benefit from specific adaptations to ride on a bike (e.g. an attendant handle, a back support, outrigger wheels or pedal accessories) to participate in regular bike riding in the community.

PLAY SKILLS

At the Dimboola campus, we have lots of resources and programs to support our student's ability to play. Play is an important skill for student development to help them learn about the world around us. Play skills can support students to develop other skills including sharing, turn-taking, social skills, problem solving, building imagination, creativity, communication, language and independence. Some play themes that students enjoy at BSDS include dress-ups, cooking, doctors, transport, dolls/small world play and shopping.



You can support students to develop play skills by getting them involved in cooking or household activities, playing sports together such as throwing a ball or hide and seek, play dress-ups with different clothes, and join in as they play with any toys at home.

Tickets will be required for all attendees to comply with COVID contract tracing requirements.

The following information is shared on behalf of researchers at The Royal Children's Hospital, who are calling for medical research participants for a new study looking to better understand medicinal cannabis. Medicinal cannabis has recently been identified as a potential therapy for the management of behavioural symptoms in children with developmental disabilities.

Researchers in Melbourne and Sydney are currently looking for children aged 6 to 18 years with both an intellectual disability and severe behaviour problems (e.g., aggression and agitation) to participate in a randomised placebo-controlled trial of cannabidiol (CBD). CBD is a legal extract from the cannabis plant. It does not cause intoxication, and it is not addictive.
