

LEARNING IN LOCKDOWN!


During our Learning from Home period, one of the stories that Rooms 1-11 focused on was called 'The Rainbow'.
















LET'S GO SHOPPING!

BSDS OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY TIPS

BILATERAL COORDINATION

What is Bilateral Coordination?

Bilateral coordination is the ability to control and use the left and right sides of the body at the same time. Bilateral coordination includes:

- 1. **Symmetrical movements:** Using both sides of the body to do the same skill at the same time i.e. using both hands to pull apart construction blocks or clapping.
- 2. **Alternating movements:** Using both sides of the body to do the same thing at alternating times i.e. riding a bike using each foot to pedal at different times.

3. **Using their dominant side and non-dominant side together:** Using each side of the body to do a different skill at the same time i.e. holding paper with one hand and cutting with scissors with the other.

Having good bilateral coordination allows the hands and feet to work well together! It shows that both sides of the brain are sharing information with each other. This is important for completing many daily activities such as walking, getting dressed, eating with hands or cutlery, toileting as well as others.

Ways to practise bilateral coordination at home:

Symmetrical movements:

- Pulling apart Lego or Duplo
- Holding a squeeze bottle with both hands to cook or paint
- Rolling a rolling pin over playdough
- Clapping and rhythm games
- Catching and throwing a ball with two hands

Alternating movements:

- Walking, running, swimming, using stairs
- Playing a drum/bongos with alternating hands
- Marching on the spot
- Peddling a bicycle

Dominant and non-dominant

- Colouring, drawing, tracing or writing
- Lacing or threading
- Cooking i.e. one hand holding the bowl and the other hand mixing, cutting up fruit with a knife etc.
- Cutting and pasting activities with scissors and glue.













KITCHEN SKILLS - PAST AND PRESENT

During Term 2, students in Room 17 learnt about technology and items from the 'past' and 'present'. Students learnt about different technology available to assist with cooking programs, including hand beaters, whisks, electric beaters and also modern ingredients such as 'jam setter'.

Students enjoyed using these different technologies to make butter and jam! After making the items they discussed and compared how well the new technologies assisted them, as well as tasting the delicious products they had made.













GREEN THUMBS - ROOM 7S

The students in Room 7S have been working hard this year growing and maintaining their garden. They use their senses of smell, touch, and sight to explore the plants and herbs they have planted.

Each week we maintain our garden with planting, watering, weeding and sweeping. With all their hard work Room 7S have managed to create a beautiful garden full lavender, parsley and rhubarb.

















BSDS SPEECH PATHOLOGY TIPS

OUR WORKSHOP PROGRAM

At the Sorrento Campus, a number of classes have been participating in a dedicated Workshop program. These therapist-led sessions have focussed on a wide range of Speech Pathology and Occupational Therapy domains.

Room 9 have used a Gift Shop recipe for Popsicle Bath Fizz to practise skills including using a visual schedule, following a recipe, matching pictures and objects, using clues to locate items in a new setting, identifying and using measuring utensils and mark-making.

The students in Room 17 have been reviewing the programs they participate in throughout the week. In this session, they have been practising their literacy skills, including letter-sound identification and word and sentence formation. They have also had the opportunity to develop their oral communication by sequencing the elements of a story to talk about their own experiences and by presenting their work to the whole class.
